THE TRAILBLAZER LUNCHEON

The YWCPA Trailblazer Luncheon scheduled for Wednesday, May 29, 2024, at the InterContinental Hotel Medical Center is a fundraising event that celebrates the promising futures of the graduating class of Young Women's College Preparatory Academy (YWCPA) and honors the outstanding achievement of women in the Greater Houston area. The YWCPA Trailblazer Award has been named in honor of Dr. Polly Sparks Turner, Chair Emeritus of the YWCPA Advisory Council.

This year, we will present the 2024 Dr. Polly Sparks Turner Trailblazer Award to Mrs. Argentina James. Having over three decades of service as a community leader, brand strategist, and public relations expert, Ms. James most recently served as the Chair of the YWCPA Advisory Council where, in just two years, she helped raise over \$250,000 in programmatic support. She has set the bar for meaningful engagement, productive leadership, and philanthropy for the YWCPA students, staff, and families. We will also present the 2024 "Because of Her" Chairperson's Award to Bethany Clarkson-Morgan. Mrs. Clarkson-Morgan has been an ardent supporter for YWCPA since its inception in 2011. From mentoring to coaching STEM competition teams, she has been a constant champion for YWCPA scholars and the work that we do with them.

Event proceeds support the work of the Young Women's Preparatory Network at Young Women's College Preparatory Academy in the Greater Houston area. Young Women's Preparatory Network is a nonprofit 501(c)(3) organization that ensures female students gain the confidence and skills to apply, attend and graduate from college.

ABOUT DR. POLLY SPARKS TURNER

A native Houstonian, Dr. Polly Sparks Turner attended Phillis Wheatley High School. She earned the Bachelor of Science degree from Texas Southern University College of Pharmacy and Health Sciences and both the Master's and doctorate degrees from The University of Texas School of Public Health.

Dr. Turner began her trailblazing career having served as the first African American Director of Pharmacy Services (in a majority hospital) at Beaumont City Hospital, Twelve Oaks Hospital and Doctors Hospital in Houston, Texas. She also served as the first Bureau Chief of Health C enter Administration and the Office of Evaluation Services, City of Houston Health and Human Services Department. Dr. Turner was the first preceptor for Texas Southern University students.

Throughout her life, Dr. Turner led and inspired others through her service on UTHealth Development Board of Directors, as Chairman Emeritus at the School of Health Professions, The University of Texas Medical Branch, as an active member of the American Public Health Association, American Colleges of Healthcare Executives, Texas Allied Health Association, American Public Health Association, and Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Incorporated.

Dr. Turner's legacy of leadership and service lives on and shines brightly through each and every scholar at the Young Women's College Preparatory Academy.

ABOUT US

YOUNG WOMEN'S COLLEGE PREPARATORY ACADEMY

As a member of the Young Women's Preparatory Network (YWPN), YWCPA is an all-girls, 6th-12th grade school that ensures its young women have the access, opportunity, preparation, and confidence that they need to matriculate a four-year degree program.

Founded in 2011, YWCPA is located in the historic Third Ward community of Houston, Texas, and serves girls from all over the Greater Houston area. Over 60 percent of YWCPA students qualify for free and/or reduced lunch; and for them, the key to breaking the cycle of poverty is through education. Focusing on empowering girls and young women through educational opportunities, YWCPA offers a quality academic curriculum concentrating on rigor, STEM engagement, and college readiness.

Since the first YWCPA students graduated from high school in 2015, 100% of graduates have been accepted to a four-year college or university. Many will be the first in their families to attend and graduate from college. Collectively, YWCPA alumnae have been awarded over \$36 million in academic and merit-based scholarships for college. In 2020, the United States Department of Education named YWCPA a Blue Ribbon School, and US News and World Report ranked it in the top 100 high school programs in the state of Texas.



Founded in 2002, the YWPN is a nonprofit agency that partners with public school districts across the state of Texas to operate the largest network of all girls, public, college preparatory schools in the nation. Its schools are located in struggling urban neighborhoods and have proven to be very successful. The schools have won multiple academic achievement awards, including being recognized among the top public schools in Texas and the nation. The YWPN is a member of the Young Women's Leadership Network and the National Coalition of Girls' Schools (NCGS).

YWPN formed the first public/private partnership with the Dallas Independent School District in August 2004, opening the Irma Lerma Rangel Young Women's Leadership School, the first all girls public school in Texas. Since then, YWPN has opened schools in Aldine, Austin, Fort Worth, Grand Prairie, Houston, Lubbock, Midland, San Antonio, and El Paso serving more than 4,600 young women annually.
